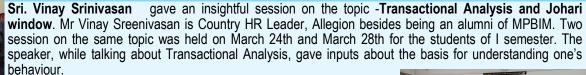

Expert talks -Sessionson TA and Johari Window



Johari window is a technique designed to help people better understand their relationship with themselves and others. It was created by psychologists Joseph Luft and Harrington Ingham in 1955, and is used primarily in self-help groups and in corporate settings as a heuristic exercise. It is very important to know one's conscious and unconscious bias to develop good Interpersonal relationships, and Mr Vinay explained this with Johari Window. The session was informative and interactive and the students felt that the session enabled them to get a better understanding of themselves (self-awareness). Akhilesh (CEO - AlpaGo & Puzzle Labs) & Ms. Apoorva Agarwal** (**Product Manager - Y Media Labs**) on Saturday, April 15th, on Product Development for Value creation & Product Management for students of 3rd Semester 2021-23 batch. Over 30 Students from Marketing participated in this insightful and interactive session. The students delved deep into the topics discussed to ask specific questions with respect to Development cycle of product, Challenges faced, Business Alignment, Career growth and immediate actions to take.

Product Development for Value Creation: In the session, the speakers touched upon How & Why MBAs should focus on becoming product developers instead of facilitators and also how it can impact the value chain of the economy. They also drew attention to the latest industry trends in Consumer markets, Creators economy, Automobiles and Retail and the latest strategies being adopted to evangelize and increase the market share of the respective product or service.

In addition to that, the speakers explained various career opportunities one can think after an MBA and gave real life examples including but not limited to industry Vertical alignment of Automobile Business and other entrepreneurial ways one has to think and how each vertical has its own benefits. Also, the speakers gave insights on various roles MBA's play and the importance of each in the ecosystem.

Product Management

In this session, the speakers provided the overview of products and how many of our day to day usable things revolve around products, and what Product Managers do to enhance the functionality as per the consumer needs. They iterated that it's important to first consider the consumer mind-set before looking into the technology for meeting customer expectations. The speakers also discussed consumer behaviour on products

by taking relevant examples (Netflix). They discussed on what it takes to launch a successful product by explaining the product lifecycle at each stage and roadmap for sustaining & competing with the market highlighting what qualities make a product great. He encouraged students to volunteer as it helps in developing relationships with the community besides improving social skills and self-confidence and provides a sense of purpose in living.

Elaborating on conceptual difference between leader and manager, she spoke on Harvard Leadership Principles like maximizing energies, achieving breakthroughs, multiplying productivity, thinking in a unique pattern, focusing on the essentials, having a strong state of mind, focusing on goals, and recharging oneself.
- * **Sri. Shivaram Ravindran** spoke on 'Innovation in Indian Markets' on 15th, 16th and 17th March 2023. He gave some ideas on where investments can be made and need to understand the nuances of stock market.
- * **Sri. N K Sundaram** spoke on 'Goal Setting for life and SWOT' on 9th and 10th March 2023. Explaining the objectives of long-term and short-term goals, he emphasized on having a goal which will give direction and focus to move progressively.
