Traditionally, an MBA was viewed as a gateway to leadership positions, higher salaries, and enhanced career prospects. It provided students with a comprehensive understanding of business functions such as marketing, finance, human resources, operations, and strategy. While these benefits continue to hold value, today's business environment demands a broader and more dynamic skill set. Organizations increasingly seek professionals who possess analytical capabilities, digital literacy, problem-solving skills, and adaptability in addition to managerial knowledge. Modern MBA programs have responded to these changing expectations by incorporating emerging subjects such as business analytics, artificial intelligence, digital marketing, sustainability, entrepreneurship, and innovation management. Such networking benefits are often difficult to replicate through short-term certification programs. Therefore, the MBA is not dead; rather, it is undergoing a transformation. In an era characterized by technological disruption and global competition, the MBA continues to remain relevant by adapting to the changing needs of businesses and society. Its future lies not in preserving traditional models but in continuously evolving to develop competent, ethical, innovative, and globally minded business leaders capable of creating sustainable value for organizations and society alike.

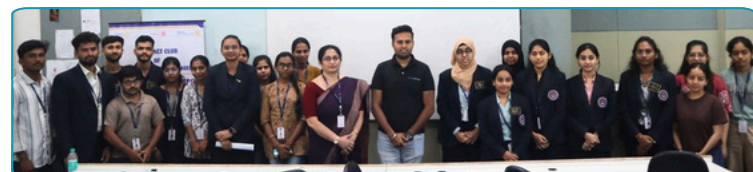
VALUE-ADDED PROGRAM ON AI & SMART PRODUCTIVITY

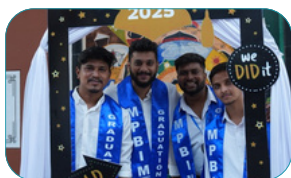

MENTAL WELL-BEING FOR FUTURE LEADERS



On 17 June 2026, **Business Analytics Club – Metamates**, organized an Expert talk on **“Mental Well-Being for Future Leaders”** by **Dr. Disha Rao, BHMS, MD (Hom)**.

The session commenced with two thought-provoking questions: “What is it that makes you happy?” and “How many of you have worried about the future in the last few days?” These questions encouraged students to reflect on their emotional state and personal experiences. Through an interactive Stress Map activity, Dr. Rao guided participants in identifying and mapping their stress levels across different dimensions, helping them understand the relationship between stress and overall well-being and explained that mental well-being is a set of capabilities that can be strengthened through recovery and self-care, meaningful social connections, a sense of purpose and meaning, and effective emotional regulation. Introducing the concept of languishing, she explained how individuals may experience a state of stagnation and reduced well-being even in the absence of mental illness, and highlighted how the principles of positive psychology can help individuals progress from languishing to flourishing. The session also addressed the consequences of neglecting mental well-being, particularly the risk of developing psychosomatic illnesses, where psychological stress manifests as physical health problems. Participants were introduced to a practical Mental Well-Being Toolkit, which covered important concepts such as neuroplasticity, the gut-brain axis, and the significance of maintaining healthy circadian rhythms. The session concluded with an engaging question-and-answer interaction, providing participants with valuable insights and practical strategies for enhancing their well-being. Dr. Rao left the students with a powerful message that mental well-being is not merely a personal concern but a valuable asset that enables individuals to thrive, lead effectively, and build a fulfilling future.

Label Making Competition: Participants created innovative beverage labels.

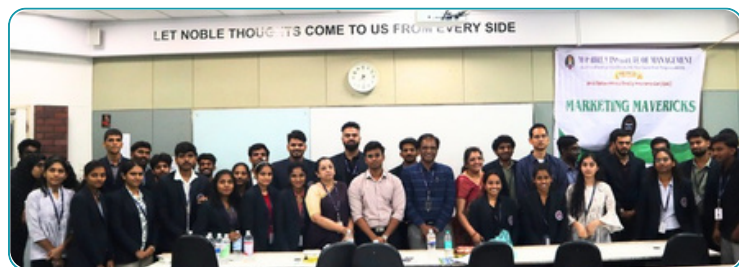
Advertisement Enactment: Teams enacted and identified famous ads.

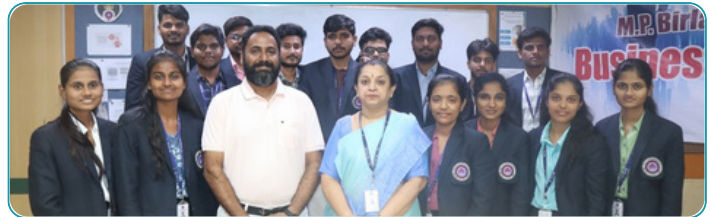

In such circumstances, corporate restructuring becomes a crucial managerial tool that enables firms to adapt, improve efficiency, and sustain competitiveness. Corporate restructuring involves significant changes in an Organization’s financial, operational, or organizational structure to enhance performance and create long-term value. Mr. Dilon highlighted, Companies that proactively restructure their finances, operations, and business models are better positioned to navigate uncertainty, seize emerging opportunities, and achieve long-term success. Effective restructuring, supported by strategic leadership, technological innovation, and employee engagement, enables organizations to transform challenges into avenues for growth & competitive advantage.



On 24 June 2026, ***“Marketing Career Growth and Impact”*** was conducted by **Mr. Vinay Simha**, Deputy General Manager - Marketing, River, a distinguished alumnus 2011-2013 batch.

Mr. Vinay highlighted how digital technologies have become an essential component of every business strategy, creating numerous employment opportunities in areas such as Search Engine Optimization (SEO), Search Engine Marketing (SEM), content marketing, email marketing, social media management, mobile marketing, affiliate marketing, and marketing automation.

He emphasized that professionals with expertise in digital tools, data analytics, and marketing platforms are increasingly valued in today’s competitive business environment. Additionally, he discussed the key skills required for a successful marketing career, including creativity, communication, analytical thinking, adaptability, problem-solving, customer relationship management, strategic decision-making, and proficiency in emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence and digital analytics. 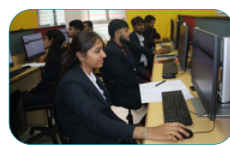
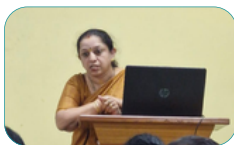

On 8 April 2026, **Prof. Vijayalakshmi**, presented research paper on *“The Impact of Diversity, Equity, Inclusivity, & Belongingness on Employee Retention in Private Hospitals in Chennai: An Empirical Study.”*

The presentation commenced by highlighting the growing importance of DEI in the workplace, particularly within India’s evolving healthcare sector. Chennai, as a major healthcare hub, faces challenges such as physician turnover, job dissatisfaction, & misalignment between organizational practices & professional expectations. The study examined private multispecialty hospitals using survey data from physicians and applied Structural Equation Modelling. The findings revealed that diversity, equity, and belongingness significantly enhance employee retention, with employee well-being acting as a key mediating factor. The session underscored DEIB as a strategic driver of workforce stability and organizational commitment.



On 21 April 2026, **Dr. Venkatesha T K**, presented research paper on *“Exploring the dynamics of Inflation in India – A comprehensive empirical analysis (1981-2021)”*

The study analyzes the short- and long-run determinants of inflation in India from 1981 to 2021 using ARDL and Quantile ARDL models. The paper is relevant to current inflation trends and policy debates in India. While the methodology effectively captures inflation dynamics, the study has limitations such as a broad research scope, weak theoretical foundation, and lack of clarity between causation and correlation. It also does not address structural breaks like the 1991 economic reforms. Key discussion points highlighted the role of supply-side factors such as food and oil prices, along with money supply and exchange rate volatility, in influencing inflation. The negative relationship between GDP growth and inflation challenges traditional theories like the Phillips Curve. The study suggests scope for future research using advanced models, structural break analysis, and sector-specific approaches.



On 7 May 2026, **Dr. Sumithra Sreenath**, *“Digital Levers for Sustainability: A Meta-Analytic Review of Digital Transformation’s Influence on ESG Performance”*

The seminar focused on how digital transformation technologies such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), ERP systems, cloud computing, and data analytics influence Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) performance in organizations. The study used a meta-analysis of 59 research articles published between 2023 and 2025 and applied theories such as the Resource-Based View, Stakeholder Theory, and Dynamic Capabilities Theory. The findings showed that digital transformation positively improves ESG performance, especially environmental sustainability and governance practices. ERP systems and business process digitization were found to have stronger ESG impact compared to some advanced AI technologies. The seminar also emphasized the need for ethical governance of AI systems, greater research from developing countries, and the role of digital innovation in improving transparency and stakeholder trust.

On 6 June 2026, **Dr. Sathyanarayana**, presented research paper *“Antecedents of work life balance and its influence on job performance, job satisfaction and job engagement evidence from the healthcare sector”.*

The paper examined the work–life balance challenges faced by medical professionals and their impact on job satisfaction, well-being, and professional effectiveness. The findings revealed that long working hours, irregular schedules, and high occupational stress significantly affect doctors' ability to maintain a healthy balance between professional and personal life. The study highlights the need for supportive organizational policies and wellness initiatives to enhance work–life balance, thereby improving both physician well-being and quality of patient care. The research further emphasizes that achieving a sustainable work–life balance is essential for reducing burnout and ensuring long-term professional commitment among healthcare practitioners.



On 10 June 2026, **Dr. Pushpa BV**, presented research paper titled *“Impact of Internship Programs on Professional and Personal Development of Business Students: A Case Study from Pakistan”*

The seminar focused on a critical evaluation of the paper, covering the research problem, theoretical framework, methodology, statistical analysis, findings, and research gaps. Special emphasis was placed on assessing the strengths and limitations of the study and exploring its relevance to management education, employability, and experiential learning. The presentation generated insightful discussions among faculty members on internship effectiveness, competency development, employability outcomes, stakeholder perspectives, and opportunities for future research in the Indian context. The deliberations highlighted the need for more rigorous empirical studies incorporating multiple stakeholders, stronger theoretical foundations, and advanced analytical approaches.

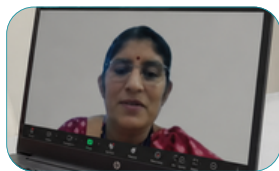


The seminar provided valuable insights into research evaluation, internship-based pedagogy, and potential areas for future collaborative research and student dissertations.

FACULTY EXTENSION LECTURE



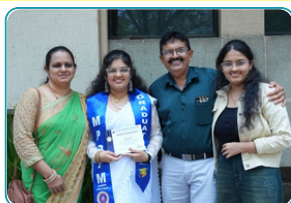

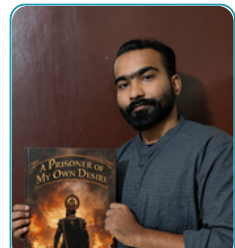
