Panel Discussion Strengthening of Ethical & Moral Values in Governance A panel discussion on Strengthening of Ethical & Moral Values in Governance was organised by IIPA

Bangalore Chapter, C-LAMPS and MPBIM Bangalore at MPBIM on 24th September 2016. Panelists were Prof. Vasanthi Srinivasan, IIMB, Prof. Sandeep Shastri Pro. Vice Chancellor, Jain University, Dr. Meenakshisundaram IAS(Retd) Former Additional Chief Secretary, Govt. of Karnataka and Sri. B L Sridhar IAS (Retd) Former Additional Chief Secretary, Govt. of Karnataka . Ms. Sowmya Aji Asst. Editor Economic Times was the moderator. Sri. S V Ranganath IAS (Retd.) Former Chief Secretary Govt of Karnataka gave the preliminary Remarks and Sri. S Ramanathan IAS (Retd.) Former Secretary, Govt. of India and Sri. S V Ranganath gave concluding remarks. Dr. H R Venkatesha welcomed the gathering and Dr. N **S Viswanath** proposed formal vote of thanks. The event witnessed active participation from the audience. When a society witnesses deteriorating ethical and moral values, it is reflective of current political and social thought. Opening the discussions, Sri S V Ranganath outlined the cause of degradation in ethical & moral values in governance and said first thing the society sees in such a situation is corruption.

The discussion touched upon the dynamics of moral and ethical values in the society which cannot be universalized. Corruption is not a new phenomenon and has been prevalent from times immemorial. Chanakya refers to different facets of corruption in his Arthashastra. The issue is now getting highlighted due to revolution in communication technology and increased awareness among people. Ms. Sowmya Aji, who moderated the discussions spoke about ethics in Journalism and questioned the value system which needs to be understood in right perspective.

The distinguished panelists from administration and from academia made brilliant presentations. During a lively interactive session after the presentations by the panelists, value education and normative behaviour as an essential part of upbringing of an individual and strict adherence to societal norms as the basic instrumentality with which corruption can be fought were highlighted. The issue of Adhar card and educating the people to bridge the digital divide in the society among the haves and have-nots of the society was dwelt upon. In the concluding remarks Sri. S Ramanathan and Sri. S V Ranganath pointed out that involvement of people is very important. While technology with human face can bring about change and there is a need to develop human values. Lakshmi Bellave and Sagar Singh of MPBIM were the rapporteurs.


Inauguration of Batch 2016-18











"Dream high and dream with ambition" was the call given by Dr. G S D Babu, Director M.P Birla Institute of Fundamental Research, in his inaugural address. Dr. Babu is a well known astronomer in the country and hails from Andhra Pradesh. He has a Masters Degree in Astro Physics from University of Hyderabad and Doctorate from Bangalore University. Dr. G. S. D. Babu, was among the first ever Indian astronomers to have set foot on the icy continent of Antarctica for carrying out a unique solar astronomy programme from the permanent Indian station called Maitri during the 1989-90 expedition. He was also the leader of the first sixmember team that ventured on an expedition to a place called Hanle, a high altitude desert area in the Ladakh region of the Trans-Himalayan ranges. Recalling his experience over the years as an administrator, he recounted his earlier days when he had no formal training as a manager and had to learn all by himself. He said though managerial qualities come by instinct, to make mark in business, one needs a undergo a structured programme which will take him/her farther in the career. He said the learning will be significant struggle, which has to be undergone with joy. Dr. Babu in his address was appreciative of the faculty who he said exuded confidence and advised students to emulate them.

Chairman welcomed the fresh batch of students. He greeted the teachers on the occasion of Teacher's Day and praised the efforts of senior professors for their contribution to MPBIM. Recalling the early days of MPBIM and tracing its growth, he said that it was gratifying to note MPBIM's 29th place on All India Ranking. He urged the students to participate more and more in the institutional programmes and said Kulpati Dr.KM Munshi's birthday i.e., 30th December would be celebrated as Vanamahotsava Day. He urged the students to be in touch with the faculty for enhancing their knowledge. He pointed out that, soon MPBIM would sign an MOU with SEAN DEE of University of Kassel Germany for conducting programmes under disaster management which would open up opportunities for overseas deputation for the faculty and students.
